Special Political Committee,

ALARMED by the presence of extremist groups in Africa, and

CONVINCED that this issue requires a multilateral and self-sustainable solution,
and

REALIZING that this must be done while maintaining respect for the
regional/demographical culture, and

1. CALLS UPON international independent funding for
 - a. Modernization of Lake Chad nations' militaries;
 - b. Construction and development of infrastructure;
 - c. General governmental expenditures;
 - d. Advancement of public services such as, but not limited to:
 - i. Educational Services
 - ii. Medical Services
 - iii. Governmental Subsidies
 - iv. Economic Development
2. INVITES NGO, third-parties, and neutral organizations to monitor fund transfer and usage.
3. CALLS UPON military action to be made against Boko Haram with;
 - A. A funding plan from willing countries into countries affected;
 - B. A combined coalition of surrounding countries to attack and defend the Basin;
 - C. Sending military drones for intelligence (no bombing runs or use of drone force);
4. ASKS FOR a parallel UN peacekeeping force to:
 - A. Take power from the Boko Haram by sending aid (water, food, shelter, etc.)
 - B. With defense to make sure our peacekeepers are protected
5. ASKS FOR a case study into whether if rerouting the waterways would be an effective way of helping the regions;
6. ENCOURAGES economic bases to get people out of refugee camps and into a stable working life;
7. RECOMMENDS economic stimulation funding plans;

8. EMPHASIZES that military actions may not be taken if it is disagreed upon by affected countries.
