

**Resolution: A-2**

**Supported by:** Saudi Arabia, Ukraine, Finland, Bolivia, China, Uruguay, Syria, Brazil, Senegal

The Special Political Committee,

ALARMED BY the growing threat of Boko Haram in the Lake Chad Basin Region and,

AWARE OF the growing refugee crisis and the disappearance of Lake Chad, and

EMPHASIZING that using military action to end Boko Haram is pressing, but is less important than humanitarian aid, and

RECOGNIZING that food and water in villages around the Lake Chad Basin are becoming scarce and more highly demanded, and

FULLY BELIEVING that humanitarian and financial aid will be most beneficial in helping refugees in and surrounding the Lake Chad Basin region, and

HAVING EXAMINED that Lake Chad has reduced by 95% in the last 45 years, and

REALIZING Boko Haram must be stopped, humanitarian aid is the most prevalent issue at this time because the longer time waited, the more people are dying, and

RECOGNIZING the efforts that have already been made by the Lake Chad Basin commission, and

RECOGNIZING education is a pressing issue, however, human well-being, and removal of Boko Haram are more prevalent, and

1. CALLS UPON nations able to provide humanitarian and financial aid;
2. FURTHER REMINDS humanitarian issues must be solved first because human safety is the most prevalent issue;
3. REQUESTS donor governments present to provide human and financial aid to help the refugee crisis;
4. AFFIRMS Nigeria is on board with the ideas presented in this working paper, as the delegate stated humanitarian issues must be tackled first;

5. **AFFIRMS** military action can be taken in an effort to keep safe the countries affected in the Lake Chad Basin
6. **RECOMMENDS** the relocation program for refugees that have been internally displaced using funding from the donor governments and giving aid to the camps and people struggling in the area;
7. **CALLS UPON** Saudi Arabia to lift oppressive sanctions from war-torn Yemen and Saudi Arabia's recognition of a two state solution;
8. **RECOMMENDS** that supporting countries join the Lake Chad Basin Commission to address all future issues, the Lake Chad Basin Commission will be a backup plan for additional issues that may rise;
9. **RECOMMENDS** the most militarily powerful nations in this resolution (UK, China, and the Russian Federation), among others, will also provide military aid in the form of money that would be used by the Lake Chad neighboring nations of the Lake Chad Basin. These nations include: Cameroon, Niger, Nigeria, and Chad.
10. **EMPHASIZES** that the military of affected states in the Lake Chad Basin should be used in defense, not offense, and that foreign military intervention should be seen as a last resort;
11. **SUGGESTS** that after the humanitarian crisis and Boko Haram has been taken care of, an enhanced education program will be put in place to address the economic needs of affected civilians pertaining to sustainable agriculture.
